Practical Nursing Program

Spring 2024 Information Sheet

The Practical Nursing (LPN) program at Southern University at Shreveport plans to begin a new class in January 2024. If you are interested in applying for this class, please read the following information carefully.

The LPN program is a 14-month training program offered through Continuing Education. Although it is not a degree program, student who qualify can still use Financial Aid to assist with the cost of tuition and books. Classes meet in-person, and are primarily Monday thru Friday from 9am – 4pm with varying hours for clinical (7a-3p, 2p-10p, or 3p-11p). The clinical hours vary depending on the course, the availability of the clinical site and the clinical instructor. There is no option for online courses.

Entry into the program is a selective process. All applications must be submitted in-person to the School of Nursing office located in the Allen building on the 3rd floor (enter through the downtown Metro Center). The deadline for application submission is **November 1, 2023 at 5pm**. Applications will be available on the nursing page of SUSLA’s website (to the left of the screen under the “Practical Nursing” tab) *OR* in the School of Nursing office. As part of the application, students must complete a Louisiana State Board of Practical Nurse Examiners (LSBPNE) approved admission test, achieving the minimum Math, Reading and Language scores listed below. These subject area scores can be achieved from a single test or multiple tests (Example: ACT only for all scores or ACT for Math; COMPASS for Reading; ACCUPLACER for Language).

The National League for Nursing (NLN) Pre-Admission Exam is no longer required. Students will only need to meet the score requirements listed above.

There are no prerequisite courses for the LPN program. However, if in the last three years, a student has taken Anatomy & Physiology I and/or II or Nutrition from an accredited college or university and earned a grade of 80% / “B” or higher, they may be eligible for advance standing, if accepted in the LPN program. Once an official transcript has been submitted to verify coursework, the student must take a challenge exam to show retained knowledge from the course(s). In order to receive advanced standing, a student must score 80% or higher on the challenge exam. All challenge exams will be administered by LPN faculty.

If a student was successful in clinical nursing courses in an RN program, they may be able to receive advanced standing in the LPN program. Again, an official transcript must be submitted in order to determine which classes are eligible. A challenge exam will be administered to show proof of course knowledge. A minimum score of 80% is required.

For those students who hold an active credential as a Certified Nursing Assistant in Louisiana, they may be able to receive advanced standing for the first Fundamentals of Nursing course (lecture + clinical). They will need to show proof of current certification (from the Louisiana CNA Registry), send the official transcript from the training facility, and pass the challenge exam + skills checkoff with a minimum of 80%.

All students must submit an official high school or GED transcript. Also, transcripts from previous attendance at any college, university or prior Practical Nursing program must be submitted to the School of Nursing. Keep in mind that in order for a transcript to be considered “official”, it must come directly from that institution to SUSLA.
