Southern University at Shreveport awarded the Frank Taylor Jr. Memorial Scholarship to DeMarcus Myers, an Engineering Technology major, in recognition of his academic achievement and demonstrated leadership potential. The scholarship honors the legacy of Frank Taylor Jr., a distinguished SUSLA alumnus whose service exemplified student advocacy and institutional leadership.

During his tenure at Southern University at Shreveport, Mr. Taylor served as Student Government Association President and as the student representative to the Southern University System Board of Supervisors. He earned an associate degree in Engineering Technology and remained a dedicated advocate for student success and higher education throughout his career.

This award reflects SUSLA's continued commitment to identifying and supporting students who embody leadership, service, and academic excellence, while reinforcing the institution's investment in developing the next generation of leaders aligned with its mission and strategic priorities.

National Recognition for AmeriCorps Seniors Foster Grandparent Program



Southern University at Shreveport's AmeriCorps Seniors Caddo/Bossier/DeSoto Foster Grandparent Volunteer Program received national recognition as one of only three awardees nationwide in the AmeriCorps Seniors Foster Grandparent Program 60th Anniversary Media Challenge, commemorating six decades of service (1965–2025).

Led by Neva Jones, Program Director, the award-winning submission documented the program's sustained impact and strong stakeholder engagement across Caddo, Bossier, and DeSoto parishes. The submission highlighted data-driven outcomes, non-federal match support, and alignment with Louisiana Department of Education and local school system priorities—reinforcing the program's credibility and long-term sustainability.

During the most recent year, 53 Foster Grandparents in Caddo/Bossier contributed more than 55,000 service hours across 25 sites, representing an estimated \$1.6 million in service value, while 37 Foster Grandparents in DeSoto Parish provided more than 38,000 hours across nine sites, valued at approximately \$1.1 million. Beyond these measurable contributions, volunteers provide consistent academic, social, and emotional support that strengthens classrooms and school communities.

This national distinction affirms SUSLA's role as a trusted community partner and underscores the Foster Grandparent Program's enduring legacy, measurable impact, and continued alignment with Reimagine SUSLA 2030.
