SUMAS Awarded \$99,768 IMLS Grant for Collection Preservation

The Southern University Museum of Art (SUMAS) at Southern University at Shreveport has been awarded a \$99,768 grant from the Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS), strengthening the museum's ability to preserve and protect its culturally significant collections. The award is part of a national initiative that distributed more than \$1.7 million in funding to Historically Black Colleges and Universities to support museums, archives, and cultural preservation efforts.

SUSLA's award also received national recognition in a news article highlighting the institutions selected for the competitive funding. The article noted that "the Southern University Museum of Art (SUMAS) will improve the care and preservation of the art, artifacts, and other significant works that are part of the collection located in a site of historical importance on the Southern University Shreveport campus."

The grant will support critical infrastructure upgrades that strengthen environmental conditions for the museum's collections. Planned improvements include enhanced environmental monitoring systems to track temperature and humidity, upgrades to cold storage equipment used to preserve sensitive works, and improved collection management practices to ensure long-term stewardship of the museum's holdings.

Beyond preservation, the project expands opportunities for students and the community to engage with the museum's collections while increasing national visibility for SUSLA's arts and heritage programming. The recognition of SUMAS in national media underscores the growing impact of the museum and reflects SUSLA's continued commitment to preserving cultural heritage while strengthening educational resources for future generations.



SUSLA Secures \$500,000 EPA Brownsfields Job Training Grant

Southern University at Shreveport (SUSLA) Workforce Development program has been awarded a significant \$500,000 grant from the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) through the Brownfields Job Training (JT) initiative. This crucial funding will empower individuals in communities affected by environmental degradation, providing them with essential training and employment opportunities.

The EPA Brownfields Job Training Program enables SUSLA to equip local residents with the skills needed for careers in environmental assessment, cleanup, and remediation. The comprehensive curriculum will cover safety protocols, environmental regulations, and hands-on technical skills, addressing the challenges posed by contaminated sites. Key to this initiative are targeted training, strong community engagement, strategic partnerships with local businesses and agencies, and a focus on sustainable practices and green job creation.

This substantial investment not only strengthens the local economy but also reaffirms SUSLA's commitment to fostering community resilience and environmental stewardship. By providing vital job training, the university will enhance career prospects for individuals and contribute positively to a cleaner, brighter future for the region.

SUSLA Launches On-Campus Health Partnership with David Raines Community Health Centers

Southern University at Shreveport has launched a new partnership with David Raines Community Health Centers to expand access to medical and behavioral health services, placing student wellness at the forefront while ensuring services are available to faculty, staff, and students. The “Wellness on Wheels” Mobile Health Unit made its inaugural campus visit at Jaguar Courtyard Housing, establishing a convenient and student-centered point of access for care. The mobile unit will now serve the campus on a recurring monthly schedule, providing primary care, preventive screenings, consultations, and behavioral health support.

By bringing healthcare directly to campus, SUSLA is removing barriers that often prevent students from seeking timely care. This initiative supports student success by:

- Increasing access to essential health services
- Addressing wellness factors that influence retention and academic performance
- Promoting a culture of proactive and preventive health engagement

While student access remains the primary focus, the availability of services to faculty and staff strengthens the overall campus environment and reinforces SUSLA’s commitment to holistic community well-being.

SUSLA Hosts 300+ Prospective Students for Immersive Campus Experience
