NURSING ASSISTANT PROGRAM

The Certified Nursing Assistant Program educates individuals to become certified nursing assistants. It is designed to provide the foundation for further preparation in nursing and lifelong learning. The purpose is to educate/train individuals to meet the basic care needs of a patient/client base residing in a long- term care facility or setting. In this program the students will acquire competencies in the provision of activities of daily living (ADL's), bedside care, and basic nursing procedures. Individuals will be prepared to practice in a variety of settings, and encouraged to continue personal and professional growth. The program emphasizes excellent teaching with a commitment to student-faculty interaction. Individual talents, backgrounds, experiences, perspectives and insights are recognized and appreciated by faculty. Students successfully completing the classroom, skills laboratory, and clinical competencies will be eligible to take the nurse aide certification exam through a national testing company, Prometric. Successful exam completers will hold the credential "Certified Nursing Assistant."

APPLICATION/ADMISSION TO THE CERTIFIED NURSING ASSISTANT PROGRAM

-Students seeking admission must submit an application to the School of Nursing no later than 30 days prior to the start of each session.

-Application to the Nursing Assistant Program is made after completing an admission application to Southern University Shreveport.

-Applicants must also obtain a criminal background check (See the last page for a list of offenses that **MAY** prevent admission into the Nursing Assistant program)

-Applicants must show evidence of screening for Tuberculosis.

-Students will be admitted to the Certified Nursing Assistant program in two admission cycles during the spring, fall and summer semesters.

-The course will be taught over a 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ week session.

-Admission to the certified nursing assistant program is based on the availability of clinical sites and faculty.

-If the number of applicants is greater than available positions, a wait list will be maintained.
