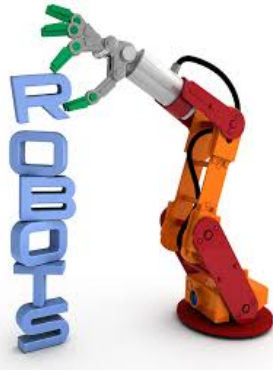
## MULTIMEDIA
