SUSLA'S EDUCATION DEPARTMENT VISITS PINE GROVE ELEMENTARY TO READ TO THE KIDS

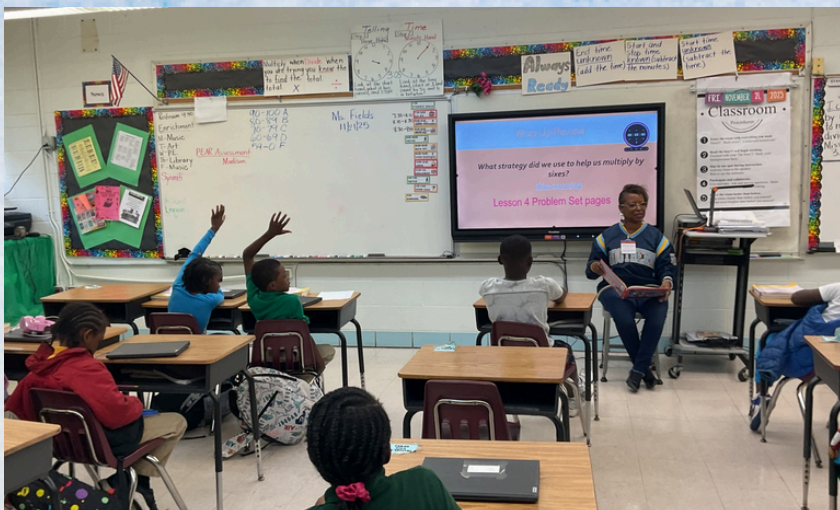
