Top Freshman at SUSLA, Awarded \$1,000 Scholarship

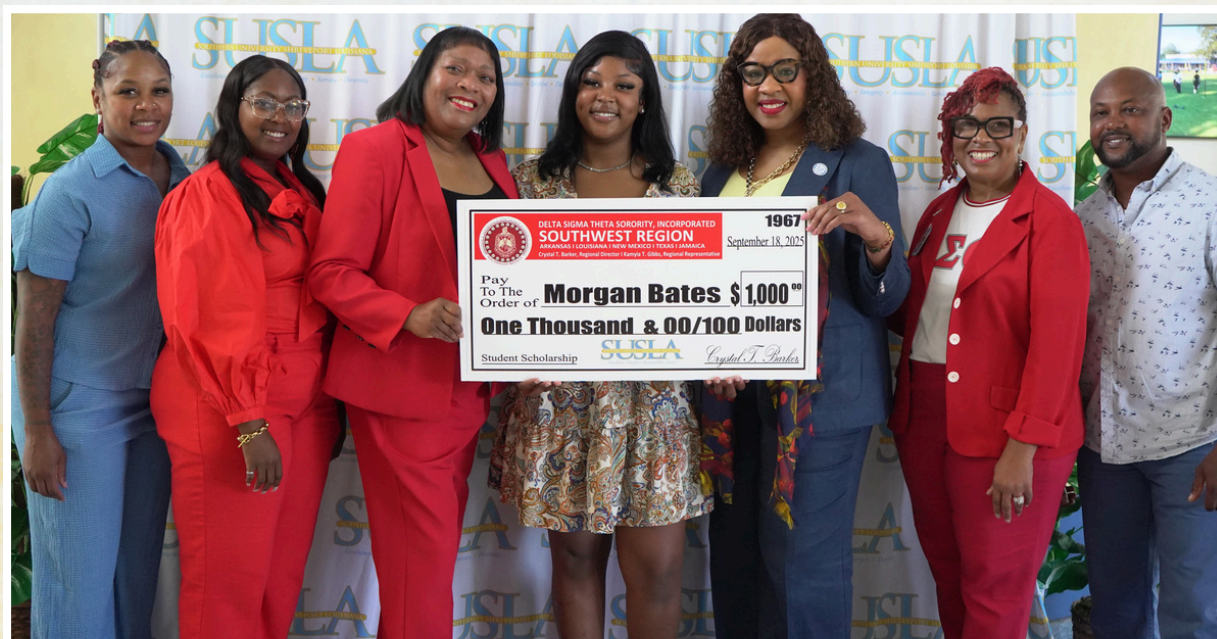
